Tidworth Tornadoes Update

ou'll remember in our last issue of Tidworth

Times we reported our very own Tidworth Tornadoes were jetting off to Spain to take part in a European Tournament. Here C'llr Anna Sharlott gives us an update on how it went. Spoiler - We're very proud!

"In April Tidworth Town Tornadoes U14s made a significant imprint in one of the



biggest European Tournaments in youth football. Matches took place over four days, with more than two hundred teams competing from over thirty five countries.

"The competition was tough. There tournament was dominated with high level academy teams; our little Tidworth Team had a huge challenge ahead. The children competed in an age category above their own and some of the players were up to four years older (due to European rules). They did us so proud and really worked as a team throughout the whole event."

"They came 9th out of 35 teams in their age category. Not only did the children put in an impressive performance but our supporters were something I have never experienced before as a football mum. The singing and cheering never stopped which made us very popular with the other teams and their supporters. We made really good friends with a German team who we hope to arrange a tournament with in the future.

"For the parents, it wasn't about the results. It was about giving the whole team an experience most grass root footballers will never be fortunate enough to get. The tans have already started to fade but the memories will remain forever.

"None of this could have been possible without the work of the whole team pulling together to fundraise. We



received some very generous donations of cash and raffle prizes and are truly grateful to everyone who made the trip possible.

"Tidworth is a very special little town and it was an honour to be part of a community who provides such opportunities for our youth. Tidworth Town Football Club has a very large membership and I'm not aware of any other local organisation with so many youth members from both the army and civilian community. I really hope that Tidworth Town FC can continue to offer this experience to youngsters in the future and that the club can continue to grow and nurture our little superstars".

We would like to find additional funding so that we can keep it free for the teens to attend as this seems to be keeping numbers higher. It's important to be able to offer somewhere safe for the teens to go where they can be supervised but not judged. Talking to some of the teens who attend they would like to see a TV and game console installed so they

can watch the football and play just dance. We have some proper cheeky characters, who attend, but they are great fun and we enjoy the banter. One night we were told "erm it's six minutes until closing" when I had the nerve to try and close

early.

On hearing that we were going to be closed over May half-term a lad called Josh commented how unfair it was and said "as long as vou're aoina to be open over the summer".

Our teens may be ones of few words but the fact that they turn up week in week out leads us to believe they enjoy the facility and having somewhere that is just for them.



So on their behalf and mine I'd like to say thank you to Paul at the Clarendon Club for leasing us his function room, to Tidworth Town Council for helping us with funding and a huge thanks to Josh 1 & 2, Sam, Robyn and Katie who give their time freely to help run the cafe.

Meet our Town Steward



ome months ago, The Editor decided to try and find out more about the positions that existed in the council and the people who fill them; these are often the very people the public see as they go about their duties. To this end, he sat down with Ro Lucas, the Town Steward, and over a curry, they discussed the role. What follows is a summary of that conversation.

The editor began by asking what the duties of a Town Steward were. And over starters, Ro gave a brief history of the recent past, explaining that his predecessor had the title "caretaker" (the editor immediately understood that job title). Ro added that these days the council employs cleaners who, on a regular basis, vacuum etc. and deal with day-to-day issues. In the event of an area specifically needing cleaning between the cleaner's visits Ro steps in. He also covers general emergency maintenance on the building & on occasions liaises with contractors the council has tasked to carry out more extensive work.

As the main course arrives, the editor asks about other aspects of the role. Ro explains that he is also responsible for checking the Community Centre Field, Play parks, Cemetery, the Mortuary Chapel and its grounds, and ensuring they are safe and the plant growth is kept under control. This is often involves strimming, cutting back hedges etc what might be summed up as general grounds maintenance. Ro does this in addition to the contractors so that if an area experiences "unexpected growth" it is cut back sooner rather than later. In particular, Ro is keen to keep the War Memorial looking at its best. It is clear from the conversation that this is the aspect of the job Ro really enjoys, not that surprising as he runs his own Grounds Maintenance business. Under closer questioning, the

editor learns that the council is building up tools and machinery so he does not need to use his own. Ro has the responsibility of advising on purchases and then maintaining equipment, including the small workshop that the council has.

As the sweets get served the conversation turns to time. The Town Steward role is a ten hour a week paid post. Ro has some flexibility in how he manages the tasks & plans activities in order to use the hours productively. He works closely with the Town Clerk who alerts him to any unexpected work, which may include, for example, the removal of fly tipped rubbish. He is also present at the setting up of some events, such as the Festival, just in case his skills and knowledge are required. The Editor left the restaurant with a deeper understanding of the role of the Town Steward and, coincidently, with а greater appreciation of older tractors.



Science Week with Clarendon Infants and Wellington Academy

fter speaking with Mr Dan Jackson, Head Teacher at Clarendon Infants, he sent me some lovely pieces of writing pupils had completed about recent activities they had taken part in.

"During Science Week we learned about the body and our bones. We made paper aeroplanes and tested them to see whose went the farthest. There was this little machine and you put the aeroplane nose first and it made the aeroplane fly. I made a dinosaur parachute and a human parachute. The T-Rex needed thicker ropes because the T-Rex was the heaviest and it needed a bigger parachute. The big children (Year 9s from Wellington Academy) came and helped us find out that the Tesco bag was the strongest. They also helped us with floating and sinking. We had a nail that's blunt and a ping pong ball, and a golf ball and tin foil and a normal ball. The nail sank because it's made out of metal and the ping-pong ball floated. The golf ball sank and the normal ball kind of floated and kind of sank. We did electronics too and the metal let the light bulb glow up and we had some plastic and it didn't let the light bulb glow up.

"The Firefighters came to see us too and told us how to stop, drop and roll. You have to do this is there is a fire in your house and some of it gets on to you. You stop, drop and roll and it gets the fire off you."

The school would like to thank the staff and pupils of Wellington Academy for their support in making Science Week such a success and Lidl Tidworth for their generosity in supporting us to resource our experiments.


